October has Columbus Day on the 11th, Navy Day is on the 27th, and Halloween on Sunday the 31st so asks local law enforcement to help with safety measures and if possible maybe they could bring a canine unit for a demonstration. Invite all neighborhood families to come out. Try to embellish it with a clown, balloons, face painting and appropriate videos and games.

Over the years I have been asked by many people in our extended family exactly who is eligible to belong to the S.A.L. The rules for eligibility are quite simple: "A direct male descendant of someone who is eligible to be a Legionnaire".

Direct Male Descendant means that the applicant is a Son, Stepson, Adopted Son, Grandson, Great-Grandson, etc. of qualified Legionnaire.

Unlike the Auxiliary who allow eligibility based on Spouses, Siblings, and their own service, SAL membership is far more restrictive. The SAL are literally "Sons". If you have any questions regarding the SAL, please do not hesitate to contact me. For God & Country

In the August issue I mentioned how a House Bill gets an endorsement from the Legion National Legislative Commission. I used as an example Congressman Alcee Hastings Bill H.R. 4541, The Veterans Pensions Protective Act. Congressman Hastings asked me if I could help get co-sponsors. I read the bill at our Post meeting and we endorsed it then sent it to Department Convention. It was also endorsed there. From Department it was sent to National. The Legislative Commission and VA Committees, along with our Legislative staff, approved it for endorsement. Already, as of this writing, Representatives Kendrick Meek, Connie Brown, Tom Rooney, Debbie Wasserman Schultz, Ron Klein, Vern Buchanan, Ileana Ros-Lehtinen, Lincoln Diaz-Balart, Mario Diaz-Balart, Alan Grayson, John Mica and Jeff Miller signed on as co-sponsors from Florida.

A letter was sent by the Department to all the other members of the Florida house asking them to sign on. If your member from your area has not signed on, ask them to do so. If 217 House members sign on the Bill can go for a vote in the House. We hope by our meeting in Washington, when our National Commander Jim Foster will give testimony before the House and Senate Joint Veterans' Affairs Committees, all 25 members from Florida will have signed on H.R. 4541.

The following members from the Florida Department of American Legion will be at the Washington Conference with me, Department Commander Al Porter, Department Adjutant Michael McDaniel, Past National Commander Clarence Hill, Past Department Commander Warren Post, Ron Musselwhite, Tim McCathy and Gerald Clark.

Tuesday, Nov. 16 Spring Hill to Lady Lake

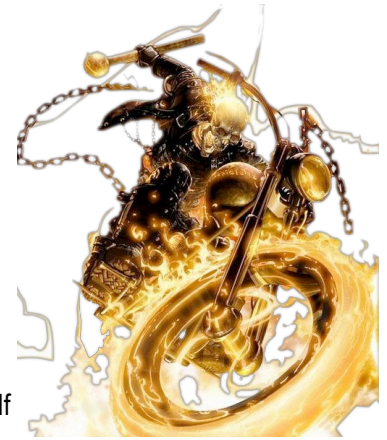
